ers in this proposal, which was in the end unanimously acceded to. The prisoners, on being placed at the bar, all pleaded guilty, and the final decision of the crown was, that they should all, without exception or discrimination, be transported beyond the seas for the term of seven years.

KIRKSTALL, in the borough of Leeds, and wap. of Skyrack, a pleasantly situated hamlet on the banks of the river Aire; 3 miles W. of Leeds. Kirkstall is celebrated for its Abbey, which deservedly ranks amongst the first monastic ruins in the kingdom. Antiquaries, Topographers and Painters, have all conspired to exhaust this subject. Henry de Lacy, in order to redeem a religious vow made in sickness, assigned over his township of Barnoldswick, in Craven, for the purpose of erecting and endowing a monastery. The building being finished in 1147, Alexander, prior of Fountain's abbey, was ordained abbot. The inhabitants, whom many of the monks had displaced, considered them as invaders, and the hostility became so inveterate that the abbot pulled down the church and transferred the religious foundation to Kirkstall, where Seletl, the superior of a small order of brethren, had already taken up his station. Here the abbot built a church in honour of the blessed virgin, and on the 19th of May, 1152, he brought over his monks from their former house to take up their residence at Kirkstall. A variety of benefactors endowed this abbey at various times with large donations, and the community became so large and opulent that at the visitation, in the year 1301, the monastery possessed 216 draught oxen, 160 cows, 152 yearlings and bullocks, 90 calves, and 4000 sheep and lambs. On the 22d of November, 1540, the house was dissolved, at which time, according to Speed, its revenues were of the annual value of £512. 13s. 4d. As we have seen, Alexander of Fountain's was the first abbot, and John Ripley was the last. On the dissolution, the site was granted by Henry VIII. to Thomas Cranmer, Archbishop of Canterbury, but it was afterwards alienated to Peter Hammond and others, and the Earl of Cardigan is the present proprietor. It is remarkable that this stately building, having been the last in this country that arrived to its full perfection and beauty, was amongst the first visited and destroyed at the dissolution. To describe a ruin on which description has already been exhausted, is an useless labour; but Gent's sketch of the dismantled abbey is so correct and spirited, that an extract from it may be acceptable. "The stately gate north-west of the abbey, (as may appear by the magnificent arches on each side

through which they were once used to pass into a spacious plain, at the west end of the church; the crystal river Aire incessantly running by with a murmuring noise; the walls of the edifice built after the manner of a cross, having nine pillars on each side from east to west, besides three at each end; the stately reverential aisles in the whole church; the places for six altars, on each side of the high altar, as appears by the stone-pots for holy water; the burial place for the monks on the south side (near the palace) now made an orchard; the arched chamber leading to the cemetery, next the church, in the walls of which are yet to be seen several large stone coffins; the dormitory, yet more south-east, with other cells and offices; all these are enough to furnish the contemplative soul with the most serious meditations. The abbey now is only a mere shell with roofless walls, having yet a well-built, but uncovered steeple, (part of this steeple has since fallen) the eastern parts embraced by its ivy, and all about the whole pile desolate, solitary and forlorn." Within the last few years considerable improvements have been made in the grounds at Kirkstall bridge, by Sir James Graham, Bart. the lessee under the Earl of Cardigan, and time, which is slowly, but steadily diminishing the ruin, is adding rapidly to the beauty of its approaches.

KIRKSTALL, AND HEADINGLEY WITH BURLEY.

KIRKSTALL, or *Kirkstall Bridge*, is a hamlet, in the wapentake of Skyrack, west riding, and in the borough of Leeds, three miles from that town, seated on the banks of the river Aire, on which are several mills, employed in the woollen manufacture, as well as in grinding corn, but the former is the chief trade of the place, and is considerable. This village is celebrated for its abbey, which deservedly ranks among the first monastic ruins in the kingdom; the building was finished in 1147, and was amongst the earliest visited and destroyed at the dissolution of monas-

teries. The abbey now is only a mere shell, with roofless walls, having yet, part of a well-built, but uncovered steeple, and time is slowly, but steadily, diminishing the ruin.

HEADINGLEY and **BURLEY** are two hamlets, in the borough of Leeds, the former two miles north-west, and the latter the like distance west of Leeds. The woollen trade, as with Kirkstall, gives employment to the chief portion of the population in these two hamlets, which, with Kirkstall, in 1821, amounted to 2,154 persons.

KIRKSTALL AND HEADINGLEY WITH BURLEY.

KIRKSTALL, or *Kirkstall Bridge*, is a hamlet, in the borough of Leeds, in the wapentake of Skyrack, West Riding, 3 miles from Leeds; seated on the banks of the river Aire, on which are several mills, employed in the woollen manufacture, as well as in grinding corn, but the former is the chief trade of the place, and is considerable. Besides these branches, there are two extensive iron founderies; at one of which is manufactured anvils, vices, spades, agricultural instruments, &c., and at the other, boilers, steam engines, hydraulic presses, &c. &c. This village is celebrated for its abbey, which deservedly ranks among the first monastic ruins in the kingdom; the building was finished in 1147, and was amongst the earliest visited and destroyed at the dissolution of monasteries. The abbey now is only a mere shell, with roofless walls, having yet part of a well-built but uncovered steeple, and time is slowly, but steadily, diminishing the ruin. A very handsome and spacious church was opened here in 1831: it is in the Gothic style of architecture, with a

neat lofty spire. The edifice is situated on the east of the village, commanding very fine and diversified views—embracing the venerable ruins of Kirkstall Abbey to the north-east, and at its foot the rapid river Aire; on the opposite banks of which the village of Bramley rises in amphitheatric form, studded around with beautiful plantations, the entire forming a most interesting and delightful scene.

HEADINGLEY and **BURLEY** form one chapelry, in the borough of Leeds, the former 2 miles N. W. and the latter the like distance W. of Leeds. The woollen trade, as with Kirkstall, gives employment to the chief portion of the population. With the exception of their manufactures, and the pleasant situation of the hamlets, nothing of importance is connected with them. A chapel for methodists, and a school, have been erected at Burley, by Mr. James Dickinson, of Leeds. Many merchants and manufacturers of Leeds have tasteful residences in the chapelry; which contained, at the last census, 3,849 inhabitants.
